

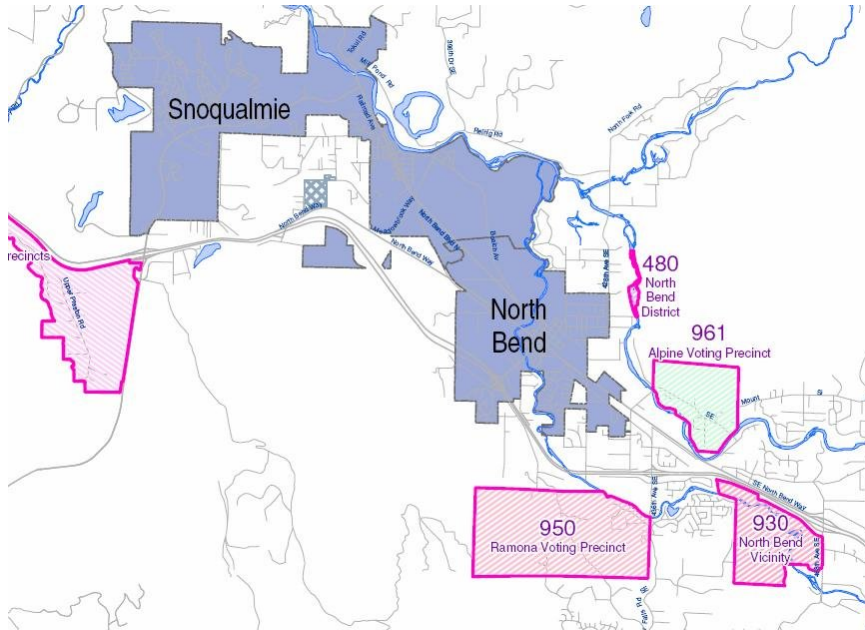
## LOCAL KING COUNTY NO SHOOTING ZONES

480 – Middle Fork channel from the Blue Hole one mile downriver to the island in the vicinity of 100th.

930 – Camp Waskowitz; Areas north of the South Fork, south of I-90, west of Edgewick and east of the trail.

950 – Ramona. Uplands north of the dump, west of Cedar Falls between 144th and 160th, south of the South Fork.

961 – Alpine. North of the Middle Fork, east of the Mt. Si. Road bridge and west of 452nd Ave.



## NORTH BEND MUNICIPAL CODE

9.30.030 Animals – Hunting, wounding or trapping of.

It is unlawful to hunt, trap or wound, or to attempt to hunt, trap or wound, any wild animal or bird upon city property. Any person who willfully, and without authority in law, hunts, wounds or traps an animal or bird, or removes or destroys the young of any such animal or the egg of any bird, is guilty of a misdemeanor.

This section shall not apply to authorized law enforcement officers, state game officials, or their designated representatives in the performance of their duties while addressing the problem of any deleterious species that causes damage, a species that is a public nuisance or health hazard or is overpopulated within a designated habitat. ## SNOQUALMIE MUNICIPAL CODE

6.08.020 Definition of "firearm."

For purposes of this chapter "firearm" shall mean a weapon or device from which a projectile or projectiles may be fired by an explosive such as gunpowder. (Ord. 1010 § 2, 2007).

6.08.030 Discharge of firearms.

A. The willful discharge of any firearm within the corporate limits of the city is hereby prohibited due to the likelihood that humans, domestic animals or wildlife will be jeopardized.

B. This section shall not apply to law enforcement officers in the performance of their duties; to lawful use of firearms by any person in lawful defense of persons or property; or to personnel of the Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife in the exercise of their official duties, or to authorized permittees of the Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife, whether on public or private lands.
